POSITION VISION AND SUMMARY:

The ReStore Driver will ensure that the Habitat for Humanity of Monroe County ReStore has safe practices on our trucks and instore, donation pickups are timely and courteous, and the truck and warehouse communication is consistent and effective. The ReStore Driver is a full time, salaried, non-exempt position working 40 hours per week, Tuesday through Saturday (and occasional evenings).

DUTIES & RESPONSIBILITIES

- Maintains ReStore policies that create a positive team-oriented environment where staff, volunteers, and customers are respected and valued
- Executes ReStore truck pickup routes that advance the mission and profits of the store
- Reinforces the Habitat for Humanity mission throughout the donation process, treating all donors with the utmost respect and gratitude and ensuring a pleasant and fulfilling experience for all volunteers
- Operates forklift, truck, and other equipment as needed
- Assists in maintaining ReStore truck maintenance and warehouse equipment

KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS, AND ABILITIES:

- Superior communication (verbal, listening, and written), organizational, and time management skills
- Comfortable in fast-paced dynamic environment that must evolve to meet the needs of the mission
- Ability to take initiative, lead, and set priorities while respecting the input and participation of volunteers and colleagues
- Talent for working in sync with a wide range of people and the ability to act as an ambassador for the mission of Habitat, focusing on customer service and a deep gratitude for community
- Good general health and able to bend, stoop, reach, climb a ladder and frequently lift 60 pounds or more
